

**Toy Story** 



History

We will learn how to be a historian and discover toys from the past whilst comparing them to the toys we play with today.

RE

We will consider the question 'What is God's job?' by investigating the role of God through stories and sacred texts and looking at what this means to different people.

Geography

We will look at toys from around the world using photos taken by Gabriele Galimberti.



We will read the story Dogger by Shirley Hughes and use this to write our own stories about a lost toy.

We will also learn how to write instructions.

This term we will journey through the past and around the world to explore the history of toys and compare them to what we have today. We will examine what materials toys are made from in science and why!

Music: We will learn about different types of music in our unit 'In the Groove'.

PE: Our PE topics this term are Dance and Invasion Games. PE days are Monday and Tuesday.

Computing: We will learn how to programme a moving robot (bee-bot).
