Term 6: How were holidays different in the past?

Geography

In our learning about the coast, we will be exploring the physical and human features we would expect to find there. We will also learn about weather patterns in the UK and hot and cold places in the world.

History

We will be using sources to discover more about what holidays were like in the past. We will learn all about Grace Darling, finding out what her life was like and why she became famous.

Science

We will continue our work about life processes and living things. This term we will focus on life cycles and food chains. We will learn more about ocean habitats and the fascinating creatures that live there.

<u>Computing</u>: Making Music. We will learn how to use computers to make music and compare how to create music digitally and non-digitally.

<u>Music</u>: In music, we will be consolidating our learning from this year and creating our own compositions.
