The Battle for Britain

Explore the significance of the Battle of Britain as a turning point in British history. Identify key figures and their impact on the outcome of the war.

History

Discover the significance of the Battle of Britain as a key turning point in WWII and the part played by the allies and axis. Find out about the life of a child during the war and how Europe was left at the end of the war. Evaluate the significance and value of primary and secondary sources of historical evidence.

Maths

Number: Place value- million, compare and order numbers to 10, rounding and negative numbers.

Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division- add and subtract numbers with more than 4 digits, multiply 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers, divide 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers. Factors, multiples, square and cube numbers. Order of operations

Science

Light recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines. Use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye. Explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes

English

Journalistic Recounts: letters and diaries
Write formal letters with a focus on formal language. Explore the world of journalism, writing reports about on current events around the world. Bias/non-biased writing. Punctuate quotes accurately and learn about bias. Write reports on the breakout of WWII and write in the role of a Spitfire pilot in the Battle of Britain.

Football improve defending and attacking. Develop control in dribbling, passing and receiving. Learn basics of goalkeeping. Evaluate performance. Learn importance of fair play and abiding by the rules.
