The Battle for Britain

Explore the significance of the Battle of Britain as a turning point in British history. Identify key figures and their impact on the outcome of the war.

Key text: Goodnight Mr Tom by Michelle Magorian

History

Discover the significance of the Battle of Britain as a key turning point in WWII and the part played by the allies and axis. Find out about the life of a child during the war and how Europe was left at the end of the war. Evaluate the significance and value of primary and secondary sources of historical evidence.

Maths

Number: Place value- numbers to 1,000,000, 10,000,000, read and write numbers to 10,000,000, powers of 10, number line to 10,000,000, compare and order any integers, round any integer and negative numbers.

Addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division- add and subtract integers, common factors and multiples, rules of divisibility, primes to 100, square and cube numbers, multiply 4-digit by 2-digits, short division, division with factors, long division, word problems, order of operations, mental

Animals including humans:

Explore the circulatory system, and consider the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on body function. Learn how nutrients and water are transported around the body. Formulate scientific questions, plan investigations to answer these questions.

English

Journalistic Recounts: letters and diaries
Write formal letters with a focus on formal language. Explore the world of journalism, writing reports about current events around the world.
Punctuate quotes accurately and learn about bias.

Write reports on the breakout of WWII and write in the role of a Spitfire pilot in the Battle of Britain.

Football improve defending and attacking. Develop control in dribbling, passing and receiving. Learn basics of goalkeeping. Evaluate performance.
